The purpose of this meeting is to bring together the talents and minds from the online forum, to meet face-to-face, and to enrich our lives and professions with each others' ideas and knowledge. *The Heart Surgery Forum* encourages everyone who enjoys this journal and the multimedia format for learning that we have developed to join us in Croatia.
